Introduction to Kurnai College

Kurnai College is located in the centre of picturesque Gippsland, a region in Victoria. Our college is a Victorian government school with 1,200 students across 3 campuses. Travelling to Melbourne CBD by car takes about 90 minutes. You can also take V/Line trains to reach Flinders Street Station in the heart of Melbourne.

Kurnai College offers Year 7-12 courses to students. The school is well-known for its high-level teaching quality, outstanding student management and state-of-art facilities. Kurnai College received government funding of \$21million to renovate school buildings and facilities. Kurnai College is now one of the most modern schools in Victoria. Currently our Morwell campus is undergoing a \$9million build project, which is due to finish in 2019.

The Gippsland region is a famous tourist attraction in Australia, with pleasant climate and beautifully varied landscapes. It offers vast golden beaches and lakes for people to enjoy the sunshine and water sports in the summer. In the winter, the mountains provide people with skiing fields and resorts.


The school's senior campus (Year 11&12) is located within the grounds of Federation University Australia. Kurnai College has established close collaborations with the university in teaching, research and facility sharing, which makes it possible for Kurnai students to interact with university students on a daily basis, and use the library, gym, cafeteria and other facilities offered by Federation University.


Kurnai College is an ideal school for international students to avoid the distractions of big cities and take advantage of the authentic English-speaking environment. Our transport system to and from Melbourne makes it possible for our international students to explore our multicultural metropolitan city, visit relatives and friends, or interact with other students during the holidays and weekends.

Lead by College Principal Mr Anthony Rodaughan and Senior Campus Principal Mr Geoff Block, the international student support team at Kurnai College includes the International Student Coordinator, Multicultural Aides, and Academic Tutors. They work closely together to ensure that our international students are provided with all-round support for life, study, interaction with Australian students, and involvement in the local community.

The number of international students at Kurnai College is maintained between 30 and 40 so that we can provide the best possible support to each and every international student. In recent years, we have welcomed international students from USA, UK, China, Germany, Japan, Korea, Indonesia, Malta, Malaysia, and Papua New Guinea. All these international students have had pleasant and unforgettable experiences during their stay at Kurnai College.









Support and Care for International Students

The success of our international students not only relies on the highquality education they receive at school, but more importantly the allround support and assistance provided by Kurnai College. This includes:

- Melbourne Airport reception by College Campus Principal and/or International Student Coordinators upon student's first arrival in Australia;
- Carefully selected homestay families (no more than 2 students per homestay, and each student has his/her own bedroom);
- Introduction and tours of surrounding areas by International Student Coordinators and/or homestay families;
- Kurnai College and/or homestay families help international students with arrangements of bank accounts, public transport, mobile phones, school enrolment and textbooks etc.;
- Kurnai College provides international students with free school uniforms;
- Kurnai College pays VCAA administration fee for international students (\$200-400 per student depending on their subjects);
- Appointment of peers and buddies for international students when they start school, to help international students adapt to new school environment;
- Kurnai College takes care of international students' welfare, including homestay, study, daily life and socialising;
- Subject teachers provide extra support and tutoring to international students after school and during school holidays;
- Kurnai College employs multicultural teachers to help international students improve study skills;
- Arrangement of "homework and study groups" during lunch time and after school for international students;
- Small English class sizes for international students;
- Close school-parent connections through overseas visa, telephone communication and emails;
- Translation of international students' semester reports to be sent to parents;
- Kurnai College provides support to international students on university application, course selection and part-time jobs, and represents students to communicate with government departments or organisations when it is appropriate to do so;
- Organising and guiding international students to take part in sports activities, excursions, entertainment and social events etc.;
- The mobile phones of the Principal and International Student Coordinators are turned on 24x7, in case of emergencies.

At Kurnai College, we understand the joy and stress experienced by international students, as well as the expectations and concerns of their parents. The support team at school, as well as all the teachers and staff members, are willing to accompany, help and support our international students to make their stay at Kurnai College an unforgettable experience in their lives.





Homestay with an Australian family

At Kurnai College, we understand the importance to provide international students with a "home-away-from-home".

Living with Australian local families helps international students to explore Australian culture, make new friends, and improve their English. Homestay families carry the responsibility of monitoring student's study and welfare out of school hours. They keep close contact with the school and report any concerns. For a fee of \$260 per week, homestay families provide all meals, accommodation and other daily necessities. Many international students establish long-lasting friendship and family bond with their homestay, and become lifelong friends even after they finish their studies at Kurnai College.

Kurnai College endeavours to select homestay families according to international students and their parents' preferences in terms of size, background and location. The College strictly follows the procedures and regulations set by the Department of Education and Training, including application screening, check of criminal records, and house inspections. To create a more suitable living environment, the school arranges no more than two students per family.

After the international students are settled in the homestay families, the International Student Coordinators keep regular contact with the families, to make sure students are well looked after and closely monitored.


In collaboration with Victorian Education Department and Australian Federation University, Kurnai College is accredited to run "University Acceleration Programs". This allows academically strong students to take a University First Year subject. This program potentially boosts these student's ATAR scores, and allows for credit transfer when they study related courses at university.





Academic Achievements

In recent years, international students at Kurnai College achieved outstanding results in their VCE exams, with an average ATAR over 85 (highest possible score is 99.95). From 2009 to 2015, a total of 31 international students graduated from Kurnai College. All received university offers (100% enrolment rate), with most admitted to prestigious universities in Australia and other countries.
