Year 7 News







As students commence their final semester at the junior campus it is important that they maintain the momentum for learning and developing sound study habits before they transition to the senior campus late in term 4. The message to the cohort throughout this semester will be:

What are you doing to prepare yourself for senior campus?

Most students have been able to quickly adjust back to remote learning, remembering to log on to their classes on time, and completing and submitting their learning tasks. Well done to those students. These times have required us all to demonstrate our resilience, and our adaptability, our ability to cope with challenges, and our skills in reaching out for help when needed. These are all amongst the most valuable skills you can have.

So, when you think this last year and a half (so far) has been a waste, think of how you respond to the challenges that are given to you.

In **Maths**, students are working on developing their linear graph skills. This is maths that's to do with relating one thing with another, what relationship we can find between them, and what we might be able to predict from the trends-certainly something we see on our daily Coronavirus briefings.

In **English**, students are thinking about how they can compare and contrast ideas; finding similarities and differences, and deciding what might be best. They initially do this by looking at a short film and reading a short story, and later by comparing life in the 1850s with life now- A good reason to watch The Man from Snowy River as a family film night!




It was great to see our students collaborate with Trafalgar High School students in refining their musical skills. Their hard work and dedication were evident in the high quality of performances during the evening concert.






